## Minister’s Musings

### The Will of the Congregation

I remember Clair Huxtable and her friends on the Cosby Show reminiscing about their favorite Hillman College professor. They laughed lovingly as they intoned in unison her oft used command, “Dig Deeper.”

In seminary, the Reverend Dr. Thandeka, our beloved - feared, respected, passionate - theology professor ingrained our religious core in similar style. After giving Thandeka a hopefully well thought out answer to her intense questions about the nature of our spirituality, she would fold her hands, peer squarely into our eyes and softly direct, “Dig Deeper.” We squirmed and valiantly tried to find that place where our true heart and reason resonate. We dug deeper and, with her next instruction, “Good! Dig deeper!” were inspired to push ourselves until we understood more of our deepest desires and convictions.

Sometimes we think we know, but when push comes to shove, when the rubber meets the road, we find confusion.

Last month UUCE took two votes on ministerial and financial options for 2011-12. Members entered into this dialogue seriously and responsibly voted. The result each time: No option was chosen. In the immediate, a sense of confusion and unease fills the air. Board members will continue to meet to discern the course which best meets the mission and vision of UUCE. But they cannot, must not, do it alone. They need your input, your brainstorming, your creativity. What must we do? “Dig Deeper!”

I am not speaking of deeper financial commitments. Of course, that would certainly aid UUCE in its decision making process. Here, though, is a request to honestly evaluate what you expect from UUCE. What is your deepest wish for this church?

What is your dream?

Is your primary need for fellowship and good discussion? How much do you value professional ministry? Would it be okay to have no minister? Or a half time minister? How about a

minister from another faith tradition? Where does social justice fit into your spiritual need spectrum? How will UUCE sustain justice work over the course of time? If you feel that ministry is not a priority at this time, how will programs be sustained? If you feel that professional ministry is a priority, how will that be achieved? What will you do to ensure the health of UUCE?

Whether UUCE becomes lay led or continues to select professional ministry as a priority worth pursuing is only the surface issue. The heart of the question requires soul searching. What is our heartfelt mission? What will I contribute to this church?

Each of us has the slick response to these questions. But we must heed the Board President’s mandate. How are you willing to change in order to produce a healthy congregation? For UUCE, it can no longer be business as usual. To find the answers, we must dig deeper.

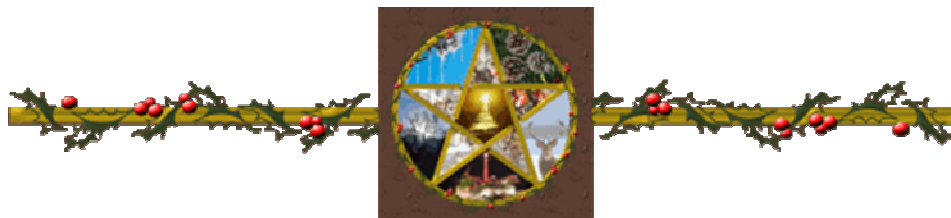

# A Word From Our President

For the past several weeks we have all been involved in discussing and deciding our financial future. This has not been an easy issue for anyone. When we decided to seek a full-time minister three years ago, we were excited and happy and anticipated good things. We made a three year agreement and financial plan with our new minister, knowing that we would be dipping heavily in to our endowment fund but having high hopes for a bright future. Then, the economy stepped in - even though we have made some progress towards our three year goals, it hasn't been enough to be able to financially continue with a full-time minister. Our hard working minister has provided lots of enthusiasm, project ideas, classes, and energy, but - like so many of us right here in our congregation - financial difficulties have stepped into change our expectations and intentions - now, we have to deal with the realities. The board felt it imperative that we bring our projected financial dilemma to the attention of our congregation for discussion. Our recent votes have confirmed that our congregation doesn't feel that we can afford to meet the financial needs of our current minister

for the upcoming fiscal year. Our current minister will continue at full salary/benefits until June 30, 2011, then we will become lay-led.

This has been a very lengthy, often stressful process for all of us, with



deep soul-searching and realistic acknowledgment of our financial status - minds have changed back and forth many times over the past weeks. Dreams have been dashed, but we need to re-group and move on. We need you to pledge, join the board, chair committees, host fundraisers, and come worship with us.

The board will be working especially hard these next few months on the issues of the Annual Budget Drive, stewardship, membership, and the financial future of our church. We will also be discussing leadership options for the next fiscal year. We would welcome any input you will share with us.

Board meetings have always been open to the congregation, except for discussion of personnel matters concerning specific individuals. You are welcome to join us on any first Monday of the month at 6:30 p.m. Our next board meeting is December 6th.

On a personal note, I sincerely thank all of you who were willing to share your thoughts at our congregational meetings - it was heartwarming to see how deeply you felt about how much this church and congregation means to you. And I also want to thank the board members for wrestling with this issue - you the congregation elected us the board to work on your behalf and to be responsible for decisions concerning the business of this church, and the board members have really put their hearts into this matter. And in spite of all the stress, etc., I am grateful to be board president at this time in our lives, to witness the concern and growth and challenges we are willing to face head-on. And I can't even begin to express how much your statements of support have touched me - thank you doesn't even begin to cover that! Sincerely,

# December Plate Share

We will Collect for the December Plate Share on December 19<sup>th</sup>.

The Aurora Homeless initiative provides direct services to the homeless, prevention services, community awareness of homelessness, collaboration among agencies advocacy for change.

The Homeless Outreach team provides street outreach and engagement services, intensive case management in emergency shelters, contracted services in transitional housing,

information and referral as well as fresh start essentials and massages.

In one year Aurora served 325 people on the streets and 144 clients. 87% graduated from the program and 84% moved into permanent housing. 75% raised their income. Aurora staff drove 23,917 miles to help those they served.
