Priorities Update

The UUCE Board of Directors has previously reported that our priorities this year are in alignment with the recommendations of our consultant, Sandra Herron, who helped identify seven priorities based on our survey results and the meeting held with her. Please let me identify the steps taken so far in pursuit of these priority areas:

Priority #1: Stabilize our financial situation – our membership approved budget for 2011-12 is leading to a successful first quarter. Look for a quarterly update from our Treasurer indicating our progress in achieving a stable, balanced budget with an excess of income over expenses and the ability to repay a portion of our endowment borrowing later this year.

Priority #2: Refine our plans and governance model for increased focus and better communication – the Church Council is disbanded in favor of direct oversight of various permanent committees and task forces by board members. Responsibilities are as follows:

Priority #3: Plan consistently-rich, engaging and inspiring worship services – Our Worship Committee is working hard to plan and implement such Sunday Services each week, but it isn't easy to achieve. If you have ideas to offer for improvement or are willing to help with the planning and/or implementation, please see a Worship Committee member (Tom, Alice or Ed.)

Priority #4: Broaden the base and skills of lay leaders and volunteers – Stewardship Committee is leading efforts to integrate and manage volunteer opportunities so that everyone can understand where they can contribute their time and talents to help our church become better at all of the things we want to achieve. In this re-

gard, our most recent attendee at Midwest Leadership School (Linda Sue Cates) is leading the effort to encourage **YOU** to attend this week-long workshop next summer. Let's plan to send a delegation, including some of our high school age youth.

Priority #5: Strengthen congregational unity, hope and care systems – Our Congregational Life Committee was formed by combining Membership Committee with Caring Committee under the leadership of Bev Tonso. Look for great things from this committee. Their newly constructed mission statement is: *The mission of the UUCE Congregational Life Committee is to reach out with loving kindness to the members of our congregation, and their families and loved ones, in order to provide nurturing, understanding, and useful supportive assistance as needed and/or requested. We seek to enhance the bond among church members/friends so that together we may celebrate joys and recognize significant milestones and transitions in individuals' lives, as*

Priority #7: Improve operational processes and committee support – hired Linda Fugate as our Administrative Office Assistant on part time basis who started on September 1st. You should think of ways in which Linda can help your committee be more effective in meeting its objectives. She has lots of computer skills and the ability to work on well-defined tasks. Let's keep her busy helping us all become more productive.

Although we have made progress on the above priorities, we still have a great deal of work to do. If you have ideas to share about ways in which the board

can support any of the above priority areas, please mention your ideas to any board member.

You may find that your personal passion is not represented in the above items. For example, the board is not focused on improving our web site, fund raising or social justice projects. It isn't that we don't care about those projects or want you to support them, but we believe the priorities identified above need to be addressed first. So until the seven priorities are satisfactorily addressed, you will find the board of directors focused primarily on these activities, although we whole heartedly encourage you to continue to support your passion.
